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Can you get a solar tax credit?

The U.S. government offers a solar tax credit that can help you recoup up to 30% of the cost of installing a solar power system. The residential clean energy credit also covers other types of renewable energy projects undertaken by homeowners, subject to certain guidelines. To claim the solar tax credit, you'll have to fill out IRS Form 5695.

When does the federal solar tax credit end?

If you've been thinking about going solar, you've probably heard the big news: the federal residential solar tax credit (Section 25D) is ending. Under changes made by the One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA) signed in July 2025, homeowners must have systems installed by December 31, 2025 to qualify for the 30% credit.

Will a solar tax credit go away in 2025?

There are two key parts of today's draft that impact homeowners who want to go solar and claim a 30% tax credit. 1) The 25D residential solar tax credit goes away 180 days after the bill is signed. Update: The final bill passed by Congress changed this deadline back to December 31, 2025.

What is a solar panel tax credit?

The solar panel tax credit allows filers to take a tax credit equal to up to 30% of eligible costs you incurred by December 31, 2025. There is no income limit to qualify. There is no solar tax credit after December 31, 2025.

Under this proposal, homeowners would have until the end of 2025 to install and place their solar systems in service to qualify for the full 30% tax credit. This aggressive timeline represents ...
